Re: Update #2 on Millbourne Flood Prevention

The Millbourne Flood Prevention Task Force has been meeting through the summer looking at ways to resolve chronic flooding issues in the neighbourhoods of Lee Ridge, Michaels Park, Tweddle Place and Richfield. The Task Force is made up of 10 community members, the Ward 11 councillor and City of Edmonton drainage staff. See

A core long term solution that has been discussed extensively by the Task Force is turning the existing dry pond along 91 Street from a surge pond into an overland flow capture pond and increasing its capacity by approximately four times. This would require removing the berm along 91 Street and replacing it with a noise prevention barrier that will allow water to flow through it into the pond.

An innovative design used successfully in Europe is a living wall. It is an effective noise barrier, aesthetically pleasing, and allows water to pass through. Task Force members favoured this option if issues concerning security, maintenance and suitability in Edmonton's climate can be resolved.

The Task Force looked at other options but felt enlarging the pond and removing the berm was the best option for a number of reasons. Complete details of what is being recommended by the Task Force will be discussed at the next town hall meeting for all interested residents.

A <u>report</u> and <u>presentation</u> to the City of Edmonton Utilities Committee by Drainage staff on August 27 highlighted the need for system improvements in at-risk areas within the city. Mill Woods and in particular Millbourne neighbourhoods were noted as priority areas for expanded flood prevention work. Design work will start in 2014 for high priority projects.

In the meantime, temporary drainage pipes have been installed through the berm along 91 Street west of Tweddle Place to provide some interim relief. Manhole covers have been plugged in low lying areas to prevent pooled water from entering the sanitary sewer.
