### Mandate

Basic literacy is essential to enable Edmontonians to have the skills necessary to improve their quality of life and in many cases end the cycle of poverty. Research indicates that people with higher literacy rates are more likely to be employed and have higher wages, stronger families and improved civic engagement. Similarly, these people are better able to adapt as new Canadians, and have healthier and more satisfying lives.

This new initiative is strongly aligned with the work of EndPovertyEdmonton and the City of Learners initiative that the Edmonton Public Library is leading on behalf of the City.

The City of Edmonton can be strong allies and advocates for the work of Edmonton Public Library and other community organizations and initiatives.

## **Desired Outcomes**

- Outcome #1: Edmontonians have an increased understanding of the importance of financial literacy through a financial empowerment approach to poverty elimination.
  - Support the Edmonton Financial Empowerment Collaborative and their activities.
  - Promote opportunities focused on vulnerable people to expand their financial literacy and knowledge, reduce debt, grow savings, build assets, increase ability to participate in the workforce and ensuring access to appropriate financial services regardless of income to improve their lives.
- Outcome #2: Edmontonians have an increased understanding of the importance of promoting literacy in day to day life as a way to end poverty, enhance quality of life, increase civic engagement, and improve social cohesion and inclusion.

- Coordinate literacy efforts throughout the city through integrated networking efforts.
- Support the Edmonton Public Library's City of Learners initiative's learning priorities.
