The Meyokumin Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal Project Team organized the following opportunities to provide feedback on the final design. Participants were invited to **ADVISE** the Project Team on any final adjustments that would align the design with the Vision and Guiding Principles for the project.



Survey

- + An online survey was available from October 13 to October 26, 2023. We shared the final design and asked you how well it reflected the Vision and Guiding Principles for the neighbourhood. We also asked if there was anything that the Project Team should be aware of that might impact the final design

- + We asked residents to visit the project web page to access information about the project, view the final design booklet, register for an online engagement session and learn more about Meyokumin Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal

Drop-in open house

- + The Project Team held an in-person, drop-in open house at St. Richard School on October 18 to hear and understand people's feedback on the final design
 - + There were display panels showing the designs to the 66 people in attendance
 - + A video highlighting main elements of the final design was also playing continuously

Online engagement session

- + On October 24, the Project Team held an online engagement session to answer people's questions on the final design
