HOW TO SET UP A CONVERSATION BOARD

Conversation boards are a great way to encourage communication between your neighbours. This board can help you get to know your neighbours and their skills, plan for group events, and share emergency information.

Choose the set-up that works best for you!

MATERIALS CHECKLIST

- » Tape
- » Dry Erase Markers
- » Note Pad
- » Sticky Note Pads
- » Chart Paper
- » White Board
- » Easel or Desk

POTENTIAL LOCATIONS:

STICKY NOTES

- 1. Write your question on a sticky note.
- 2. Place the sticky note on a wall within your desired location.
- 3. Leave the pens and extra sticky notes in the basket close to the wall.

CHART PAPER

- 1. Tape up a large piece of paper on a wall within your desired location.
- 2. Write your question on the paper.
- 3. Leave the pens in the basket close to the wall.

WHITE BOARD

- 1. Set up the easel and place the white board on it.
- 2. Write your question on the white board.
- 3. Leave the dry erase markers in the basket close to the white board.

HERE'S A TIP:

Update your conversation board with new prompts regularly. Find a schedule that works for you!
