

International Student Housing Guide



Navigating housing as a full-time student can be challenging. This guide outlines affordable housing opportunities, tenant support services and practical tips for international students in their search for a home during their studies in Edmonton. Whether you're new to the city or seeking a more suitable living arrangement, knowing your options and what resources are available to you can simplify this process.

Key Considerations for Housing Research

- Research in Advance: Start your housing research
 2-3 months ahead of your planned move-in date
 and contact potential accommodations 2-3 weeks
 prior for a tour.
- 2. **Rent Breakdown:** Review the rent specifics for each room option available.
- Facility Assessment: Evaluate layouts, available amenities and facilities provided by the housing option.
- Included Utilities: Clarify what utilities or other costs are covered in the rent. Accommodations that include utilities can often be more economical.
- Leasing Terms: Understand the different leasing options available. Get the tenancy agreement in writing. The Landlord is required to give you a copy within 21 days for you to keep.
- Accommodation Inspection Report: Inspection
 reports document the property's condition when
 tenants move in and out, conducted within a week
 of these events. Landlords must provide tenants
 with a copy of the report, detailing any noticeable
 damages.

- 7. **Damage Deposit:** Collected at the beginning of the tenancy and are refundable if there is no damage to the unit. The deposit cannot exceed one month's rent. RTA Section 4
- 8. **Proximity to Post-Secondary Institution:**Consider the distance from your
 institution—whether within walking distance or
 accessible via public transit—and the transit time
 involved.
- 9. **Schedule In-Person Tours:** Contact the landlord or property manager to schedule an in-person tour.
- 10. Ask Detailed Questions: Prepare a list of questions to ask during your tour and inquire extensively to gather all necessary information.
- 11. **Tenant Insurance:** It aims to cover repair costs for damage caused to your living space due to your actions and replace any damaged personal belongings. You can get tenant insurance through insurance providers, banks, or insurance brokers.

Following these guidelines will enable you to conduct thorough research and make informed decisions when selecting suitable housing options as a student.
